Very little is explicitly designed to support state and provincial level programs. If GCF states and</p>

provinces are to realize their potential for re-directing rural development to maintain remaining forests and enhance the productive potential of existing agricultural and grazing lands, new sources and forms of financing are needed. This session will explore some of the most promising opportunities for financing jurisdiction-level REDD+ within the GCF, and the institutional innovations that could help to seize these opportunities.
